## **Speaker Bill Moser will present**

### **The History of IMMACULATE CONCEPTION CHURCH**

Originally named St. Cecilia's Church, Immaculate Conception it had its beginnings, in 1916, in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Hugh F. Cowdin. The first Holy Mass was celebrated in the Cowdin's living room, in February of 1916.

The first recorded Baptism was that of Mary Jean Geppert, infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R.C. Geppert, by the Revered Thomas C. Powers, C.M. on November 28, 1916. Father Powers also officiated at the first recorded marriage, that of Cornelius A. Vernoy and Vivienne F. Lichter on October 24, 1917. Father Leo V. Moore recorded the first death in the parish, May 30, 1921, that of Hugh F. Cowdin, the benefactor and builder of the church.

Our speaker, **William R. (Bill) Moser** has been the Senior Vice President at Grand Bank of Texas in Grand Prairie since 2001.

He received his BA in Economics from the University of Dallas, Irving, Texas, in 1982 and his MBA in General / International Business from the University of Dallas, Irving, Texas in 1983.

He is currently studying Catholic Bible Study at the University of Dallas, School of Ministry, with an anticipated graduation in 2017.

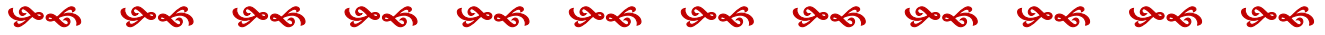
